## **Rent and Utility Payment Assistance Programs**

If you have experienced a change in your income, or you are having trouble paying your back rent and utilities, you may qualify for payment assistance.

## Here is How to get Help!

**Detroit Coronavirus Emergency Rental Assistance (CERA) Program**: The COVID Emergency Rental Assistance (CERA) program helps keep Detroit residents who are behind on their rent during COVID-19 in their homes. Financial assistance is available for renters with past due rent and utilities. Free legal representation may also be available for renters with court cases.

<u>Step 1:</u> **Be Proactive- If you have experienced a change in your income,** call your property manager to report a change in your circumstances.

Step 2: Get help by calling the Detroit Eviction Helpline- Call (866) 313-2520 to get more information about you might qualify for up to 12 months of rental payment assistance and \$2,500 in utility payment assistance. The helpline is open Monday-Friday from 8:00 AM-5:00 PM and on Saturday from 9:00 AM-12:00 PM.

<u>Step 3:</u> **Apply for assistance** - Complete an online application at <u>ceraapp.michigan.gov</u>. In the landlord section of the application, add DHC as the landlord and use email address, <u>cera@dhcmi.org</u>. DHC will be notified that you have applied for assistance.

<u>Step 4:</u> **Get help by calling 211 - Call 2-1-1** and ask how you can get help paying your utility bill or go to www.mi211.org to learn about agencies that may assist you with your energy bill.

<u>Step 5:</u> **State Emergency Relief (SER) Program** - Apply directly at <u>newmibridges.michigan.gov</u> for bill payment assistance or call **855-275-6424**.

<u>Step 6:</u> **Apply for a Home Heating Credit Starting January 1st** –Applications are accepted January 1 - September 30 each year. Even though this funding is distributed by the MI Dept. of Treasury, you do not need to pay taxes or wait for a tax return to receive this credit. You can apply any time after January 1.

- Pick up a paper copy at a public library, post office, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) office or other locations where income tax forms are available.
- Call the Department of Treasury at 517-636-4486.
- If you are hearing- or speech-impaired, contact the Michigan Relay Center, 800-649-2777 or 7-1-1.

<u>Step 7:</u> **Get caught up on your rent with a DHC Repayment Agreement-** Call your property manager to ask if you qualify for a repayment agreement.
